Trip to Culloden Battlefield

On the way back North after meeting the whisky and gin enthusiasts of Aberdeen Craig paid a visit to one of the places that holds huge significance in Highland history, Culloden Battlefield. On the 16th of April 1746 the Jacobites faced off against the forces of the British government. The bloody battle that ensued lasted less than an hour but as the smoke settled almost 2000 Highland clansmen lay dead and along with them the Jacobite cause. We will be launching our investment on the 16th of April 2016, exactly 270 years after the infamous battle, we aim to bring traditional Highland distilling back to its independent community roots, we think the Jacobites would be proud!
