On an interesting side note, Glenskiach who we take part of our history from was one of the original 40 whiskies included in the first Dewars blend. It was a great experience to visit these distilleries which have such an iconic place in the history of Scottish Whisky – a history we hope to be writing the next chapter in. After the AGM at the Atholl palace there was a fantastic three course meal followed by the presentation of awards. We were very honoured to receive the gold award for Innovation, anyone who follows what we do here at GlenWyvis will know innovation is at the heart of everything we do so it was a great honour to receive this prestigious award.

The build warrant is in place for the 1st of April 2016 and we are working with the Plunkett Foundation to have our share offer ready for February 2016.
