GlenWyvis Gin

As many of you know our limited edition gin was launched at the Global Energy Stadium here in Dingwall in front of a packed home crowd on the 25th of July. Since then the sales of the gin have been fantastic. Many local retailers have stocks of the Gin. Made with local botanicals our key ingredient is Hawthorn berries. Skiach is gaelic for Hawthorn -the river starts within 'The Ben' and splits off towards Evanton past the old Glenskiach distillery site. Water also flows down into the hydro dam through the farm and onwards to Dingwall. Some of our gin has even made it as far afield as the USA and New Zealand. Our marketing and sales assistant Craig is out and about delivering to new retailers around the North weekly. A list of stockists will be published on social media later in October so you can find your nearest one. With only 3000 bottles our reach is limited but we are expanding further each week and will soon hit the West coast - prior to Christmas you will be able to purchase our gin online for a short period also.
